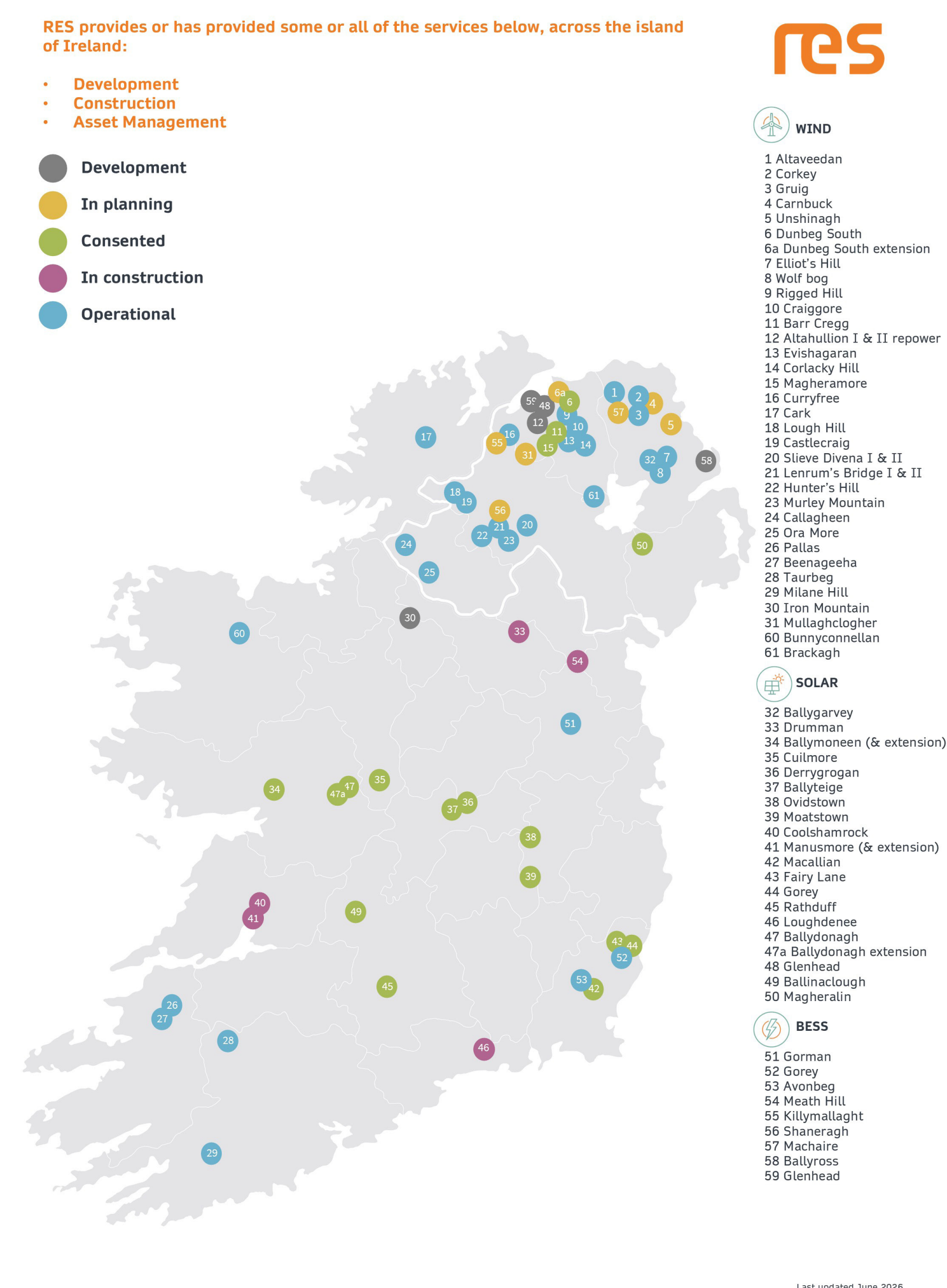

We currently expect to submit the application later this year to the Department for Infrastructure (DfI).

A Pre-Application Community Consultation (PACC) Report will accompany the planning application submission. The report will summarise the consultation activity that has been undertaken, the feedback received, and how we have responded to it.

Once submitted, DfI will advertise the planning submission and hold a statutory consultation period whereupon members of the public as well as statutory consultees, can submit their formal comments on the proposal.
